In the previous post, I showed you the easiest way to add a Disqus comments widget to your Blogger blog. Of course, there are other ways to add this commenting system to your blog, ways that give you more control over its appearance. If you're the geeky type, you should do this manually. In this post I am going to show you how to control the installation and customize the widget to your liking. This tutorial can also come in handy when the Disqus gadget installer isn't working. In short today, we'll look at a manual way of installing the Disqus commenting system on your Blogger blog.

IMPORTANT: This method requires you to edit the HTML of your blog's template, so it is highly recommended that you back up your template before continuing. Also, this method won't work on Blogger Dynamic Views templates.

The importer will filter out duplicate comments unless youve changed some of the comment data. Email addresses are unique identifiers in Disqus, so make sure each unique user has their own email address before importing. Otherwise all comments will appear from the same user. Imported comments cant be permanently deleted. Consider following our guidelines for development sites to make sure the data youre importing is correct. You can register a new forum if you have imported the wrong comments. If you were using Wordpress and youre converting your website into.NET or Umbraco then the easiest

way to do this is to import your comments within Wordpress itself before you move your website over. Sometimes this isn't possible and you need to manually import your Wordpress comments into Disqus. In case you are wondering why you need to worry about Umbraco, when you import comments into Disqus, you can add a unique ID and Url. In your new website, the only way you can get this is using the Umbraco API. So without further ado, let's crack on. The view model itself is pretty straightforward. This is where the logic happens that reads the CSV and converts it into our view models and returns it back to our view. One thing to note is that I'm using the VisualBasic TextFieldParser to do the CSV conversion. So, you will need to add a reference to Visual Basic. I'm also assuming that when you imported your blog posts from Wordpress to Umbraco, you also stored the Wordpress Id. If you didn't then that will make things a lot more complicated. If you find yourself in this situation, I suggest you try to reimport your Wordpress Id. To clarify, I have my Wordpress ID in my Umbraco document type within a property called This is done in a razor view. My view is called disqus.

cshtml I went to the Disqus page and copied the XML format, listed by Disqus. I then iterate through all of my comments building up the page and inserting the relevant bits of data within the tags. Please note I'm using my Umbraco page ID and URL as the unique Disqus identifiers. Be careful not to export the HTML, e.g. do a view page source, copy and paste your XML into a blank text file and save it. An example of my XML looked like this Some useful things to note first, though. Make sure your file is a valid XML. Wordpress export can sometimes add funky things into your content, which you may need to manually correct invalid characters etc. You can check if your XML is valid using the free W3C validation service here. Login into your WordPress site as admin. Type disqus in the search box and from the results click on Install Now next to the Disqus Comment System. After installation, activate the plugin. From the screen asking you to upgrade, click on the Upgrade button. This is used to connect your site to a Disqus profile. At this log into Disqus if you already have a profile. If not click on don't have a Disqus Profile yet. Sign up for a Disqus profile. Click on the Start Using Engage button at the bottom of the page. Disqus will verify its availability and prompt you to choose a different name if it is not available. Several options like Auto, Business, Culture, News and Sports are available. Choose the site which you just added and click on Next. As of now, there are no comments here. After enabling you can change other settings too if you so wish. There are some very basic options like the forum shortname and where the Disqus comments should be used, as well as advanced ones.

You may have to wait for a few seconds to a few hours depending on the number of comments in your site. This takes you to the moderation dashboard again. Go ahead and install Disqus commenting system and watch the discussions happen between readers logging in through various social media. Please try again later. Back in Blogger I had been using Disqus comments but still had some old comments in its native comment system. This is a stark contrast to how easy they make importing WordPress or Blogger comments into their platform. Here's what I did. Should it fail or if your site is not live yet, try the manual installation outlined in Step 2. Activate the plugin then open the Disqus menu which will have replaced the Comments option. Connect the plugin with your Disqus account by following the prompts in the Install tab. Start by copying the installation token provided in step 3 then click the WordPress installation page button. Clicking that button will take you to Disqus where you'll be prompted to select your site first. After selecting your site you'll be taken to a page where you'll now have to enter the Installation Token we copied if it's not already inputted for you. Click the Install button to complete the setup. Disqus will contact your site and finish the installation. If you encounter an error, retry by clicking the install button again. Go back to the plugin page and you should find the Installation is now complete. Now proceed to Step 3 below.

To do that Create an API application by clicking the link provided just below it. Register a new application in the API page by entering your site details. Access the application details and copy the Secret key, Public key and Access Token. Go to the application settings and add your site in the Domain section then under Authentication set Default Access to Read, Write and Manage Forums. Go back to the Disqus plugin, switch to the Site Configuration tab and enter the Shortname, Secret and Public keys.

After doing you can now sync your comments as explained in step 3 below. Enter the dates of the comments you wish to import into WordPress and click the Run Manual Sync button. The maximum period you can sync at any one time is 1 year. If you have comments spanning several years, you'll have to run separate syncs for them. The sync will import the comments for the entered period. You can check the imported comments by clicking the View WordPress Comments button at the top of the Syncing page. If not all the comments are imported trying running the manual sync again. After its done importing deactivate the Disqus plugin to switch back to the native WordPress comments. If this happens to you make sure your post URLs match with those in Disqus. So give it some few days then try running the sync again. Make sure to trash the old comments before running the sync again. Prior to making this blog live, I was developing it using a host file modification. Soon after it went live most of the comments synced with posts though there were still exceptions. This plugin however hasn't been updated for almost 3 years now and as a result doesn't work with new WordPress versions. In this post, I will let you know how to migrate the older comments to Disqus. The threaded comments and replies, powerful moderation and admin tools, RSS options and many more features come in as batteries included with Disqus which makes the commenting more interactive and easy to deal with. Till date importing the old comments directly from the blogger and wordpress to disqus is feasible. This can be achieved by using tools and plugins that are already existing in them and its pretty straight forward. In this post our prime concern will be laid on custom XML import format. If you are using neither blogger, nor wordpress the custom XML import format which is based on the WXR WordPress eXtended RSS schema comes to the rescue. Disqus also supports MovableType, and IntenseDebate but preferably WXR is of more concern. This process of migrating the comments to disqus comprises of two steps in this case. This format is normally used for importing or exporting data from wordpress servers. Now the aim is to create a WXR file from the existing comments in our storage. For that we are going to write a python script. Disqus has prescribed a format of the file that we are planning to import to Disqus. The format looks in the following way. As I am not using the SSO in the site, we can remove the. The link specifies the site url to the specific post. In my case I happened to find some encoding issues with the which does take the whole body of the post so I preferred removing it from the WXR file and it worked fine. I accessed my comment model to get the comment data. And then I created the xml file in the format prescribed by Disqus. I skipped some tags which ought to mess up encryption issues. But beware, try to create as the disqus prescribes for the easy flow. The script looks like the following way.

You can get to know more about creating a Disqus site in the linked blogpost. There appears the settings page, click on the discussion on the right top panel. Click "import" tab and there appears the different types of import formats that Disqus supports. Select generic WXR and click on browse. Upload the Disqus.xml file and once the process gets completed it shows up if there are any errors in the uploaded file. If there are any errors, the process of importing comments will be kept on hold. If the comments are successfully imported it takes some time to get those comments reflected in your site. You have to import all your 10 custom post type comments separately, each type editing the code. I was using Disqus before but I decided to move back. Disqus provides a tool that you can export all your comments but unfortunately, they will provide you with XML format. The worst thing is WordPress only reads WXR file format.

My problem is that I don't know what is the basic structure of the WordPress comments required. My only concern here is I just need a template or format which I can follow on how to write a correct WXR file comments so that I can import it directly in my WordPress using the Import Tool. By the way, when I try to upload the XML file to WordPress, I get this error. It can be located on the Advanced Options tab inside the plugin. That's where I get the error. Recently I figured out some way to do the parsing and insert the comments into WordPress database, all is written only in PHP please refer to this link, any feedback is welcome. However, I'm now back using vanilla WordPress and I'd like to stop using Disqus. That doesn't seem to be the case any more. They were just out there in the wilds of WordPress land with no post to support them. Well, that process is convoluted and fairly manual. I'm sure there are better, more automated ways to do this, but this is the process that worked for me. The first thing you need to do is go in to the settings for the Disqus plugin and carry out either an automatic or manual sync. Personally, I went for a manual sync, as I was intending to remove the Disqus plugin ASAP. They should all be assigned to the appropriate post on your site. However, if you install the Tako Movable Comments plugin, you can! Here you will be able to assign a comment to a post. After all, I could just continue to use Disqus on my WordPress site. The biggest being the widely reported privacy and security issues that have plagued Disqus. Secondly, I also want to be in control of all the data on my site where possible.

Information tracked by Disqus, which may be disclosed to third parties, includes pseudonymous analytics data, such as a user's IP address, their web browser version and installed addons, and their referring pages and exit links. Although these data are referred to by Disqus as "NonPersonally Identifiable Information", such data, when aggregated, has been shown to be usable for deanonymizing users. Disqus has also been criticized for publishing its registered users' entire commenting histories, along with a list of connected blogs and services, on the publicly viewable user profile pages. The option to keep profile activity private was later added. — Wikipedia Having said that, I'm almost certain that I am missing comments from Disqus, but it's the best I could do. It

seems that they're making it deliberately difficult for their users to migrate away from the tool where ever possible. Poor XML export, limitations on the amount of comments you can sync, no syncing with WordPress by default. These all seem like unnecessary limitations that are designed to lock blog owners in to their tool. But I will keep my Disqus account open so I can continue to comment on other blogs that use the platform. Do you have concerns about your privacy when using Disqus. We have not tested the Disqus plugin so we couldn't give a recommendation. I suppose I could install the official plugin, sync, then uninstall, etc. And, that initial export, and keeping the systems in sync, would seem to be pretty important features. So we'll be exporting the comments and importing them to a temporary WordPress website free, and then we'll import comments from WordPress to Squarespace. Disqus uses a different syncing interface now in the Wordpress plugin and, at best, you can only manually sync the last 12 months of comments to the Wordpress database. The good news is that I've had autosync on almost continuously since I launched my site in 2011. That's why I have over 200,000 comments in my Wordpress database. But the numbers don't exactly match. And I don't want to lose any comments if it can be helped.
