I paid more for this alarm thinking I could arm and disarm the alarm using the app no such luck. The app device control and push notifications only work during the day. At night post 11pm they dont function at all. Since they work perfectly during the day its obviously a bug with the app. At night I open the app, click Disarm, the screen updates, I close the app and reopen it, and it shows the alarm is still armed. During the day that functionality works just fine. Not at night. I dont have any Do Not Disturb times set on the app or my phone, and yet push notifications just stop working at night. 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So pretty worthless if you wanted to disarm from the app when coming home late or be notified of someone entering while youre out for the evening. Theres no way to disable this blackout time period and customer service is nonresponsive. Its cheap as well. You can also put an alarm if you want, if not thats okay too. Has two options, chime or alarm. I personally put chime because the alarm is to much for me. I have weak wifi I believe under 2.4ghz but it still work good. I recommend. They gave suggestions on how to get it working which I tried but to no avail. Had to return. I love love love how your phone alerts you. Dont even think about it. Just buy it! Extremely easy to setup, comes with all the mounting needs. The alarm sound is pretty loud and notifications are instant too. The only feature i would like to see added to this device is the ability to disarm the alarm from the app instead of going physically to the device and putting the code to disarm it. Perhaps this can be achieved with software update may be! I have the correct WiFi and have so many other devices that paired fine. I even did troubleshooting with their YouTube pairing videos. Needless to say, complete waste of time, I will be returning my two devices ASAP! It is supposed to have three levels of notifications when a door is opened or closed. Firstly, an audible double beep sounds from the unit on the door. That works around the clock. Then the wifi part of it sends a notification to your Iphone or android, which is supposed to sound a double tone alarm from the phone as well. This is what we were hoping for. We bought this unit to wake us when our young daughter leaves her room several times a night. You cant arm it, or disarm it. There is no alarm that sounds on the phones, which is what we purchased it for. You have to wake it at the unit, but then it

When we wake in the morning, we get the inapp time stamps of all the times she was up. But no audible notifications aside from the unit, which is on a different level of the house from our bedroom. We also used the inapp report function to send this issue to the company and over a week later still have not received any kind of response from the company. Ill finish by saying that my husband and I are quite tech savvy. If it functioned as it should, this would have been a great product. My use for the product was to monitor our front door on the house; so we arm it every night. We are using it strictly for the builtin siren and not the phone notification since we can easily hear it from our bedroom. First the siren is nice and loud which is great but the wifi integration is where this unit collapses. First the unit will constantly go into sleep mode which is totally understandable since it runs on battery but it makes it unusable most of the time from the app. When the unit is in sleep mode it doesnt wake when you try to arm or disarm from the phone making that part pretty useless. If you want to use it at a door as a standalone system with siren and forget about the wifi this thing is great. Lastly the battery life isnt great, I need to replace batteries once a month so 2 x AAA batteries per month. I am using the Amazon basic batteries because of the bang for the buck but it has become irritating so I will be trying energizer lithiums next to see if I can get more time. I may even try disabling the wifi to see if this extends the battery life as well, I even tried rechargeable batteries but that DOES NOT work trust me!! I hope this helps someone out there. Alarm volume is pretty loud, door alert delay is only around 3 seconds and price is very reasonable. I love knowing my front door is secure when I'm not home. Thank you Braumm! I had those one with the chime option, the extra option sometimes are not as convinient for doors that are meant to be shut most of the time. I like it for my back door. Well, I have learned, to always read the reviews, before buying. Sometimes the reviews can be off, but not always. This device, I saw, it had nine reviews, with perfect scores. One of the reviews I read, a man was saying how loud it was, and it even scared him.

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I am here to confirm this device deserves a 10 star rating. Many of those, who wrote reviews, talked about how you could hear the noise on the second floor. Indeed you can! Upstairs, we have fans running constantly, to help keep our place cool, and many times we cannot hear a thing. I bought 2 packs, because you get two alarms, in one pack. This device is all that and a bag of chips. First make

sure to test it once you open your box. Secondly to see how the device stays silent, line up the arrows the alarm and the smaller piece. Third before installing, make sure not to remove paper from the back of the device, until you test it manually, where you are going to place the device. Test to make sure it works, where you decide to place it. Lastly make sure both pieces are pretty close together, I would suggest, put your alarm up high, so you know where it is. If someone, does come in, the intruder will not have time to smash it. Make sure if the alarm is armed, move to get outside that door very quickly, or disarm it, and have someone arm it behind you. I have mine upside down. This alarm is the best!The first product I ordered would not work on my door frames for those reasons. The large portion sticks securely to the frame even though there is not a completely flat portion on the framing large enough to accommodate the entire back of the large piece. My other door worked out better because it opened inward to the left which meant that I could mount the smaller portion on the framing. The frame does have a space wide enough that the smaller piece could mount flat on the narrow portion of the framing. The alarm is loud, but not so ear damaging that it is painful. I will not have any problems hearing it all over my 1400 sq foot home. The alarms stops immediately when the door closes in case you open the door without turning the alarm off. It will only alarm if the magnetic connection remains broken.

I have very secure windows that have been installed in my home that would pretty much require breaking them to enter. I just wanted something that would alert me that the door had been opened. I just dont want anybody coming in on me unawares. My chihuahua would bark, but she is not big enough to scare anyone off. I am at the age that I am not willing to die for anything that I have in my home except maybe my chihuahua. I also sleep with a taser type flashlight bought for protection after dangerous dogs attacked my dogs multiple times when walking in my bed that would pretty much knock anyone out enough to allow me to escape. My neighborhood is fairly safe. It is more for psychological peace of mind then anything else. I sleep better knowing that the alarm is there to notify me if the door is opened. It works better than the large bells that I had hanging from the doorknobs previously. The dog will be happy that the bells are gone as they scared her to death every time I opened the doors!If the 2 surfaces aren't on the same plane, the alarm will go off. The pictures shown from other customers are similar to my set up, but it did not work for me. Mine were too sensitive and went off where the 2 surfaces were flush I placed the alarm on the door upside down. They can also be used for security while your walking. Carry it in your hand, and trip the switch if need be. It is ear piercing. I have not found the volumn. They won't be able to think straight with it going off.This is great if you are alone, upstairs, or asleep. Might not be a problem at all design wise. However, when entering or leaving your place it is pretty obnoxious. Of course, you can use the alarm as per your convenience and use it as needed. Very satisfied, especially considering the price. From there, we looked at ease of installation, responsiveness, app navigation, and other factors that make the best door and window sensors. Your imagination is your only limit. And with the handy Wyze Cam, you can check in if a sensor alerts you that someone is where they shouldn't be. The Wyze app lets you name each device in your home so you'll know which entrance opened instantly. But this versatile device can also tell you when it senses vibrations, falls at an odd angle, or senses temperature out of the ordinary. If someone tampers with it or it's exposed to extreme temperatures like those in a house fire, the SmartThings app would let you know immediately. Folks with larger homes may need a range extender to boost the signal between devices. These window and door sensors need to be within 30 to 50 feet to communicate with the hub, so choose the most vulnerable areas in your home and cover those first. If you want a sensor that detects more than just an open door or window, the SmartThings is the smart choice for an affordable price. But opting for super

smart sensors will mean you end up paying more for each piece of equipment than for our top pick Wyze. Use doublesided tape to stick this alarm to your windows, door frames, cabinets, and other entryways. So as the baby gains mobility or an area goes offlimits, you'll know when someone's entering an area they shouldn't. This standalone system doesn't require contracts or monthly monitoring, making it easy to self monitor your home from anywhere. They don't require a hub to activate, making them a good option for standalone security.
