That being said, this book is not hard to follow, nor are the tutorials particularly hard to implement or understand except when the end result does not mirror what is displayed in the book after you follow the instructions down to a T. A typo or other error after every 10 pages for a book that has over 1000 is a little much. Most of the examples work, but when you get into the dynamic website tutorials towards the end.lets just say that there is a few CHAPTERS 24 and 25 for sure of mismatched diagrams to say the least. So I am not sure if the examples are malfunctioning because of erroneous steps or if its just me. The author still hasnt responded to my question. The feedback isnt really all that hot either. On a positive note I will say the author doesanexcellentjobexplaining yes I did that on purpose as a joke what everything is and how it works the basics that is. He makes it fun to read, and everything user friendly for the most part. He also provides a plethora of resources to use on various topics that you might need in the web development world. In this area I feel he went out of his way to help, which is good.

I am not sure if I would buy another book by this guy. I like his style and attention to detail.but the typos and errata are driving me crazy. Overall. I still feel torn over whether this book is worth what I paid for it.But in the end I figured why not learn dreamweaver. I bought this book having zero experience with either dreamweaver or web design. I am not particularly good at such things but the Sawyer does an excellent job of explaining things in a way that makes a dry subject a little easier. I have not read the book cover to cover, or in order even. I just look up what I want to do in the index or contents and read what he says about it. It is a very skim friendly book. One word of warning, however, is if you want to create your own dynamic website from scratch you will need this book and then a book on either php or asp etc. If you only want a static site, then this book and some internet

searching for tips is all you will ever need, but if you want a dynamic site this book takes you part of the way, but he can't write for every language you could use to make it dynamic. Sawyer is way, way better than the authors of those other 2. I don't get the other 2 at all, but this book on Dreamweaver will enable anyone to learn how to make their own site, upload it and maintain it. Probably my second favorite behind the books from No Starch. If you are stuck at a company that doesn't want to update and need a book for CS5 I would definitely recommend this one. For advanced users it includes a very helpful section on building dynamic websites with MySQL and PHP. This is a great resource for every Dreamweaver user, at many different levels of competency. The author blends and balances conceptual overview, description, detail and tutorials superbly. I was a complete novice but now I have enough working knowledge to finish my first website. This book is thorough and written in a very comprehensible manner. There's a tutorial where you build a website for a

fictitious Cafe and learn how to use Dreamweavers builtin tools. At first sight, its a little overwhelming nearly 1,000 pages of hefty reading but its easy to digest if youre motivated to build a website from scratch. I had one issue with this manual.

The codes are, however, scattered throughout the book. Overall, I believe this truly is the Manual that should have been included in Adobes Dreamweaver CS6. Revisiting the subject a few years later with CS6, I am delighted to observe that the instruction in this manual is also an excellent basis for beginning a more serious acquisition of skills in HTML and CSS for which I now feel ready. This book wont make anyone an expert web designer overnight, but it provides a great start for people who wish to get up and running fast and also begin learning whats under the hood. I do recommend that users pursue other sources for the more advanced features of CSS3 and HTML5. My only disappointment was that when I purchased the CS4 manual, the ecopy was provided for free but this is no longer the case. Not till I began reading this manual did I realize how Id been missing many, many features and creative steps offered by Dreamweaver 6. Ive decided to start a new website alongside what Im learning from this book and its already increased my excitement. I highly recommend this book for anyone who works with Dreamweaver 6. They usually focus on describing the functionality, hold your hand and go step by step building whatever project they showcase. However, they do little work explaining WHY are those steps taken and what happens if you change something. This book is not exception. It is great if you already know what you want to do and you are looking for a quick way to adapt it to Dreameaver. However, if you are looking for a real understanding of how Dreamweaver works and you hope someday you wont need someone to hold your hand, you might want to look somewhere else I wasnt happy with the book that was chosen. While I didnt assign this additional text to the students, I mentioned it and one student did purchase it. She also felt it was better than the assigned text.

I was able to use this for additional material and tips that I could add into my lectures and it even included a few tricks I didnt know. I really like this author!!
